What is this resource?

This document provides a comprehensive log of resources that are available online to support the commissioning of services to improve children and young people's emotional health, behaviour and wellbeing. The name of the resource is given, along with a URL of where to find it online, target audience and a brief description of what the resource is about.

Who is this resource for?

This resource will be useful for experienced commissioners, and those less experienced in commissioning/procuring services for emotional and behavioural difficulties. It is also targeted at the voluntary and community sector, with a number of resources suggesting ways in which organisations can strengthen their relationships with traditional commissioners and schools.
