Submission of evidence: Children and Families Act 2014

For the House of Lords Select Committee, 25/04/2022

What we want to see from the government in the next six months:

- 1. Make sure people under the age of 18 can join in with policy discussions.
- 2. Make it easier for people to find out if their child can have free school meals.
- 3. Make sure that there are ways for everyone to access, understand and respond to the Act. Ask all sorts of different people how to do that best.
- 4. Once everyone has had a chance to understand the Act it should be checked and changed again if needed.
- 5. The offices of the Children's Commissioner should work with local offices more, so that more people can be involved and their opinions can be heard.
- 6. Learn from good examples of co-production (for example The <u>Resilience Revolution</u>, <u>Blackpool Beating Bullying</u>, <u>principles of integrated care</u>, and '<u>Health as a Social Movement</u>'). Coproduction is where people with different types of experience work together as equals to make decisions.

What we want to see from the government in the next year:

- 1. Get stories of how the legislation is working in real life for people from across the UK. (see Part 2.6).
- 2. Give free school meals to all pupils in areas where there are lots of people facing difficulties.
- 3. Make a co-produced disability and/or mental health 'passport' that is accepted everywhere.
- 4. Co-produce a formal plan to make it easier for people to get the support that they are allowed from places like school, healthcare and social services, outlined in Part 3: Sections 22/30.
- 5. Local Authority officers should help with jobs and other life goals for children who are looked after.
- 6. When the government makes decisions about what they will focus on, it should be a legal requirement to include young people and families in those decisions. It should be clear how those young people and families will be paid for their time.
- 7. Local authorities should co-produce ways to reduce the numbers of children in long term stay units, which are separating children and young people from their families and communities.
- 8. Check Part 10: Section 138 of the Act and make changes if needed to make sure co-production work gets given enough money, time and attention.
